
Resource Industry in Papua New Guinea

Industry Benefits

PNG is one of the few countries in the world where mining and petroleum projects offer socio-economic benefits to local areas they operate in, providing hope and opportunity to its people.

- 26% of PNG's GDP and 80% of the nation's export revenue (valued at K23 billion) is contributed by the resource sector
- The sector directly employs **20,000** and supports a further **30,000** jobs in landowner and local businesses

- The industry is a key contributor to PNG's society and invests millions of Kina into community development programs such as:
 - Health and education
 - Enhanced infrastructure
 - Employment and training
 - Agriculture programs
 - Law and justice
 - Roads and airstrips
 - Business Development
 - Women Empowerment

Future of Industry

- There is huge potential for further development opportunities in the mining and petroleum sectors within the next five years. However, the legal, fiscal and regulatory regimes must be strong.

- Proposed changes to the Mining Act 1992 will have severe negative impacts on the immediate and longterm development of both existing operations and proposed projects
- Industry is also supportive of Government's desire to set up a Petroleum Resources Authority and we are committed to ensure this happens very soon.
- Gas White Paper will be observed with interest by the sector in terms of how it engages, for example, in the legislation space – Petroleum Resources Authority Act.
